We are excited and honored to share with you some great news. U.S. Secretary of Education, John B. King, Jr., announced on Wednesday, September 28th that St. Joseph School has been named a 2016 National Blue Ribbon School. St. Joseph School is one among 279 public and 50 private schools receiving this honor. The National Blue Ribbon Schools Program honors public and private elementary, middle, and high schools where students achieve very high learning standards or are making notable improvements in closing the achievement gap. The award affirms the hard work of students, educators, families, and communities in creating safe and welcoming schools where students master challenging content. The National Blue Ribbon Schools flag gracing a school's building is a widely recognized symbol of exemplary teaching and learning. National Blue Ribbon Schools are an inspiration and a model for schools still striving for excellence.

Now in its 34th year, the National Blue Ribbon Schools Program has bestowed this coveted award on fewer than 8,500 schools. Mrs. Ashby and I will represent Saint Joseph's at a two-day awards ceremony in Washington, D.C., to celebrate the schools hard-won achievements.

Principal's Scholars Recognized at Awards Dinner

It is also a homecoming for our more recent freshmen as they are acknowledged for their work in 8th grade. In addition, we induct the 8th grade graduates who earned recognition into the National Junior Honor Society during the award portion of the evening. An advance 'Thank you' goes out to Mrs. Karen Ellis, our chairperson who spent her summer coordinating this wonderful event.

The Knott Scholarship Funds announce the availability of full tuition scholarships for the 2017/2018 academic year. These scholarships are for four years, beginning in 5th grade or in 9th grade, and are awarded based on exceptional academic achievement.

Catholic students currently in grades 4 or 8 living in Baltimore City,

Anne Arundel, Baltimore,

Carroll, Frederick, Harford or Howard County may apply. Scholarships may be Knott Scholarship

used to attend a Catholic elementary school or a Catholic high school located in these geographic areas of the Archdiocese of Baltimore.

Scholarship Program

The Maryland State Council of the Knights of Columbus in partnership with the Knights of Columbus Insurance Advisors is the sponsor of several High School Scholarships for its members and for Catholic students in general. Below is a brief summary of these scholarships and information regarding eligibility for scholarship awards.

The Frederick M. Gossman Memorial High School Scholarship

Designed to assist those Brother Knights holding membership in councils within the jurisdiction of Maryland in paying tuition for their sons and daughters at accredited Catholic High Schools; three grants of \$1,500.00 per year, for up to four years, will be awarded. Awards will be made on the basis of <u>academic excellence</u>, <u>personal qualifications</u>, and <u>financial need</u>. The children of deceased members are also eligible, provided the member was in good standing at the time of death.

The William J. O'Brien Jr., Memorial Catholic High School Scholarship

Three grants of \$1,500.00 per year for up to four years will be awarded. This program is open to any <u>Catholic student</u> who is a resident of the State of Maryland to include children and grandchildren of a member of a Knights of Columbus council within the jurisdiction of Maryland. Applicants must have been officially accepted at or must be students at accredited Catholic High Schools. Applications will be judged on <u>academic excellence</u>, personal qualifications, and <u>financial need</u>.

Application period is from October 1, 2016 to February 1, 2017. All applications must be received by the Scholarship Committee no later than February 1, 2017.
