COUNSELORS CORNER

Our annual Student Retreat was held this past Thursday. Your children were given the unique opportunity to literally "retreat" from the hustle and bustle of their normal busy lives to connect with themselves, others and with their faith.

In the morning, students rotated through three sessions: Growth Mindset, Mindfulness and Adoration.

The portion devoted to Mindfulness also included yoga, thanks to the tremendous efforts of one of our parents, Mrs. Comey, who enlisted yoga/mindfulness teachers from her place of work. I am very grateful to her and all the teachers who generously volunteered their time to work with our students.

Students truly "learned by doing" and came away with a better understanding of how yoga and mindfulness complement one another.

The volunteer instructors were so impressed with how engaged, open and respectful the students were during their time together, and it is our hope to continue to offer opportunities for you and your children to build on the knowledge they have gained from this experience.

In the months preceding the retreat, I visited all classes to introduce the concept of Mindfulness, the benefits and application in education, sports etc., as well as the role it plays in their Catholic faith. Students practiced mindful listening, as well as other exercises, such as deep breathing, providing tools to manage stress and approach situations more calmly and thoughtfully.

Many of you attended the November HASA Meeting in which our speaker, Jacqueline Stilling, gave a presentation on this topic.

As more research and evidence continues to deepen our understanding of the role mindfulness can play in enhancing learning and growth both in school, we will continue to explore ways to integrate components of this practice in our program.

Please feel free to contact me for more information and resources on Mindfulness. There are wonderful books for all ages, videos, apps and articles on this topic.

Also, I can forward Jacqueline Stilling's power point from the HASA presentation if you are interested and did not receive it.

On another note, I did want to mention that the controversial Netflix series, 13 Reasons Why, has been very popular among teens. I have gathered a lot of information about the show, and wholeheartedly agree with the concerns that have been raised about the show and it's message.


