Commencement Activities

Nothing is more exciting than cheering for our 8th graders as they leave campus on their last school day on **Thursday, May 31st.** The '**Drive-Off'** parade begins at 3:00. LIBRARY CLEAN UP

If you have an hour to spare, we are looking to make sure our school library books are in the right shelves and in the right order. OVERDUE BOOKS

If a Library overdue notice came home with your child, please encourage your child to check their book shelves, bedroom, and backpacks, at home! We don't want to make you purchase and replace the book. Most times the book is found! Thank you for your cooperation.

THIS SUMMER - AN IDEA THAT WILL SAVE TIME FOR YOU IN THE FALL-

If you have some time this summer, it would help if you could TYPE up mailing addresses for our Race for Education donor mailing in October. Your middle school child could help you with this. This way, when that letter comes home in October, you can hit PRINT and be done with it! The post office told us last year that they will not mail any handwritten mailing labels (we get the BULK MAILING RATE, but we must follow their rules!). Save the file and all you have to do is print it out each year.

From the Nurse:

Parents/Guardians of current 5th grade students: Upon entering 6th grade in the 2018-2019 school year, all 6th grade students will need an updated Health Physical. This ensures that I am up to date on any medical concerns or new medications your child may be taking. I sent a notice home on March 6, 2018, advising parents/guardians of this requirement. You can print off the Maryland School Record of Physical Examination Form on School Admin or from the school website.

Parents/Guardians of current 6th grade students: Upon entering 7th grade, all 7th grade students are required to submit an updated Immunization record in order to enter 7th grade in the Fall. Proof must be provided that 1 dose each of Tdap and MCV (Meningococcal) vaccine has been administered in order to enter 7th grade for the 2018-2019 school year. I sent a notice home March 3, 2018, advising parents of the immunization requirement, in order to afford parents plenty of time to contact their pediatrician's office to request an updated record and verify that the vaccines have been administered already. Most students have received these vaccines, however, their immunization records on file in my office are from when they first entered school originally and must be updated. You may have an updated record faxed to school, if more convenient: fax # 410-529-7234. I will be sending a reminder notice home again in May to those that have not submitted an updated record, before school concludes for this current year. You may contact me if you have any questions. Please note: State law requires proof be provided, a child has up to 20 days from the start of the 2018-2019 school year to provide a current immunization record, after which, exclusion from school will be enforced.

***Please remember, if your child/ren has **ANY** medication(s) in the Nurse's office, they **MUST** be picked up the last week of school or they **WILL** be disposed of accordingly.

Spring is here, along with those dreaded seasonal allergies. If your child suffers from seasonal allergies and you typically treat with OTC allergy medications, please be mindful of needing to treat them before allergies get out of hand. Also, as the weather changes, our climate in school does as well. The classrooms begin to get 'warmer' and students require more hydration. Consider

increasing the amount of fluids your child takes in daily to counteract headaches, dehydration and allergy symptoms. Other ways to counteract allergy symptoms is to wash face and hands when returning in from outside. Simply washing allergens off your skin can greatly reduce exposure and symptoms.

Thank you for saving for future education costs with the Maryland College Investment Plan.

The enclosed supplement outlines important changes to the Plan as a result of the recent passing of tax reform measures that were signed into law on December 22, 2017. The information in the supplement updates the Maryland College Investment Plan Disclosure Statement, dated December 2017. Please read this information carefully and keep it with your current copy of the Plan Disclosure Statement.

We would like to make you aware of the following updates:

- Qualified higher education expenses have been expanded to include elementary and secondary tuition expenses. Specifically, you are now permitted to distribute not more than \$10,000 (per Beneficiary, per tax year) in expenses for tuition incurred in connection with the enrollment or attendance of the Beneficiary at a public, private or religious elementary or secondary school.
- Rollovers are now permitted from a Qualified Tuition Program to an Achieving a Better Life Experience (ABLE) account.

Additionally, the supplement provides the expected inception date of March 29, 2018 (with purchase availability on April 3, 2018), for the three new Fixed Portfolios: the Equity Index 500 Portfolio, Extended Equity Market Index Portfolio, and U.S. Bond Enhanced Index Portfolio.

We appreciate your participation in the Maryland College Investment Plan and look forward to continuing to help you reach your education savings goals. IMPORTANT UPDATE TO THE MARYLAND COLLEGE INVESTMENT PLAN

This supplement amends the Maryland College Investment Plan Disclosure Statement, dated December 2017. You should review this information carefully and keep it with your current copy of the Plan Disclosure Statement.

Tax Reform Measures

On December 22, 2017, amendments to the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (the "Code") were signed into law and included the following changes that impact Section 529 college savings plans:

<u>Changes to Qualified Higher Education Expenses</u>: Effective January 1, 2018, the definition of "Qualified Higher Education Expenses" under the Code has been expanded to include tuition expenses used for elementary or secondary education. The total amount of elementary and secondary school tuition expenses considered to be Qualified Higher Education Expenses is limited to \$10,000 per year per Beneficiary.

<u>Changes to Rollover Distributions</u>: Rollovers will be permitted from Qualified Tuition Programs to eligible Achieving a Better Life Experience (ABLE) accounts. This change is effective as of December 22, 2017, through at least December 31, 2025. Any rollover from a Qualified Tuition Program to an ABLE account is subject to the ABLE account's annual contribution limit as limited by Section 529A of the Code or the state sponsor of the ABLE account.

Accordingly, the following updates are being made to the Maryland College Investment Plan Disclosure Statement.

On page 4, the first sentence of the definition of "Qualified Higher Education Expenses" is replaced with the following:

Qualified Higher Education Expenses as set forth in Section 529 of the Code.

On page 4, the following paragraph is added to the definition of "Qualified Higher Education Expenses":

5) Tuition expenses in connection with enrollment or attendance at an elementary or secondary public, private, or religious school (up to a maximum of \$10,000 per year per Beneficiary).

Also on page 4, the definition of Rollover Distribution is replaced with the following paragraph:

Rollover Distribution: A transfer of assets between Qualified Tuition Programs for the same Beneficiary, provided another rollover or transfer for the same Beneficiary has not occurred in the previous 12 months, or for a different Beneficiary, provided that the receiving Beneficiary is a Member of the Family of the original Beneficiary (as defined in this Plan Disclosure Statement). Rollover Distributions also include a transfer of assets from a Qualified Tuition Program to an Achieving a Better Life Experience (ABLE) account for the same Beneficiary or for a different beneficiary, provided that the receiving beneficiary is a Member of the Family of the original Beneficiary. Please consult with the receiving ABLE plan to confirm any additional restrictions or requirements imposed by the ABLE plan.

On page 30, "Rollover Distribution" under "How to Take a Distribution" is replaced with the following paragraph:

Rollover Distribution. To qualify as a Rollover Distribution, the amount distributed from your Account must be reinvested into another Qualified Tuition Program or into an ABLE account within 60 days of the distribution date.

Additionally, as indicated in the Plan Disclosure Statement dated December 2017, three new Fixed Portfolios—the Equity Index 500 Portfolio, Extended Equity Market Index Portfolio, and U.S. Bond Enhanced Index Portfolio—are to be introduced in the first quarter of 2018. It is expected that all three portfolios will incept on March 29, 2018, and become available for purchases on April 3, 2018.



Tired of struggling with your child to get their homework done?

Dear Parents,

We would like to introduce you to the Homework Connection Primary (HWCP) at St. Joseph's! Homework Connection Primary is an after school program which runs for an hour, Monday through Thursday from



Dismissal (3:00PM) until 4:05PM. It is held in Room 2. Students will be dismissed from the Library's back door. Our purpose is for students to have the opportunity to learn good work habits and complete their homework with the support of a teacher.

Students (Gr. 1-3 only) can:

- Work on written and study homework with the support of Homework Connection staff.
- Enjoy a small snack to get energy to tackle their work.
- Work on their homework after school in a quiet, safe environment so that you can enjoy more family time at home.

Teachers (Ms. James, Mrs. Berg, Mrs. Visalli) will:

- Be on hand to aid students with any difficulties they might encounter with their work.
- Review homework and offer corrections.
- Actively study with students by quizzing, reviewing (i.e. math facts-flash cards), and asking questions.

NOTE: This is a group setting; therefore teachers cannot be tutoring individuals.

The cost of the Homework Connection would be \$9 per day with a minimum commitment of two days/week per session. Anyone coming less than two days/week per session will be considered as a drop-in and charged \$12 per day. Payment is due by Thursday of the first week of the session. Any payments received after will be assessed a late fee of \$15. Staffing is based on number of students enrolled on any given day of a session. No refunds for students who are absent or don't attend. Make checks payable to Kathy James.

Enrollment is open each session. If you would like to drop in, you need to email the teacher as soon as possible to make sure there is enough room for your child. *Unless you have teacher confirmation via email or phone call that there is space available, your child CANNOT drop in.*
